AED awareness just be boosted

Good article (Samia This Week, Nov. 15) regarding the need to increase the number of people trained in CPR and increasing the public's awareness of automated external defibrillators (AED).

I am delighted to say that about 3,000 area youth are currently learning CPR and AED skills each year thanks to a school-based program in which Samia-Lambton and Chatham-Kenthigh schools deliver CPR and AED training to all students at the Grade 9 level every year. With the support of partners, the ACT Foundation has ensured schools receive the donations of hundreds of training mannequins, AED training units, and defibrillators. High school teachers have been trained as CPR and defibrillator instructors for their students.

The ACT Foundation is working in partnership with the Govemment of Ontario and partners to equip high schools throughout Ontario with the CPR and AED program, startup resources, and teacher training so schools can deliver the program and ensure all youth receive this lifesaving training as part of their high school education. CPR was inserted into the provincial curriculum in 1999 and over 1.4 million students have been trained by their teachers to date.

By ensuring CPR and AED training is free for all students as a part of their high school experience, we are ensuring all youth receive the training and it becomes a life skill.
