## The ACT High School CPR and Defibrillator Program British Columbia

### **CPR Program – British Columbia**

- **415,000** youth trained to date through high school program;
- **236** secondary schools across BC have established the program;
- **45,000** students trained by their high school teachers every year;
- **7,000+** durable mannequins donated to schools by ACT and partners;
- **1,300+** teachers trained to date as CPR instructors for their students.

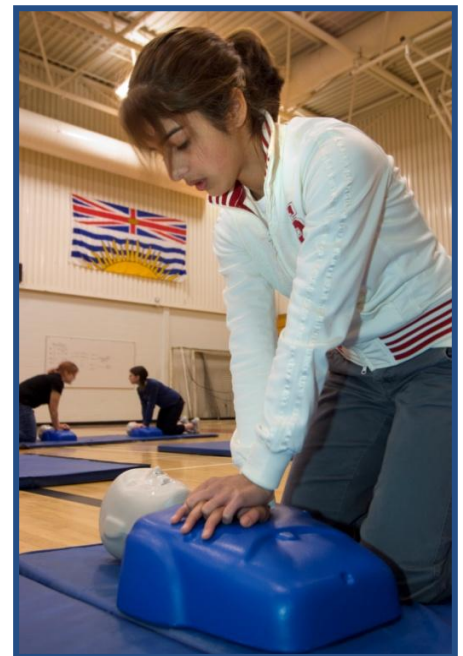
### **ACT is now enhancing the CPR program with defibrillator training!**

Since the Automated External Defibrillator (AED) enhancement started in 2012:

- **64,000** students now trained in both CPR & AED;
- **134** secondary schools have the CPR program with AED enhancement;
- **450+** teachers have been trained as CPR & AED instructors for students.
