The ACT High School CPR and Defibrillator Program Ontario

CPR Program – Ontario

- **2 million** youth trained to date through high school program;
- **755** high schools across Ontario have established the program;
- **160,000** students trained by their high school teachers every year;
- **20,000+** durable mannequins donated to schools by ACT and partners;
- **2,300+** teachers trained to date as CPR instructors for their students.

ACT is now enhancing the CPR program with defibrillator training!

Since the Automated External Defibrillator (AED) enhancement in 2008:

- **615,000** students now trained in both CPR & AED (**125,000** more each year);
- **648** high schools have the CPR program with AED enhancement;
- **1,700+** teachers have been trained as CPR & AED instructors for students.
