A lifesaving day

Local politicians tested their CPR skills Friday at Bear Creek Secondary School in Barrie, including mayor Jeff Lehman, Barrie MPP Aileen Carroll and Innisfil Mayor Barb Baguley. Their visit highlighted a demonstration to promote an initiative to ensure local high school students have CPR and defibrillator training. The day was organized in part by the ACT Foundation, which works in partnership with its provincial partners – the province and The Ontario Trillium Foundation, and lead community partners – the County of Simcoe, the Elston Foundation, the Optimist Club of Barrie and TransCanada Corporation, along with many community partners. National health partners of the program include AstraZeneca Canada, Bristol-Myers Squibb Canada, Pfizer Canada and sanofi-aventis. All Grade 9 students in both the public and separate boards will undergo training on the lifesaving skills.
