ACT has achieved **100%** of its provincial goal in Alberta. Program set-up is complete and ACT is now focusing our efforts on sustainability.

- **660,000+** youth trained to date through high school program;
- **315** high schools across Alberta have established the program;
- **45,000** students trained by their high school teachers every year;
- **9,600** durable mannequins donated to schools by ACT and partners;
- **1,000+** teachers trained to date as CPR instructors for their students.
